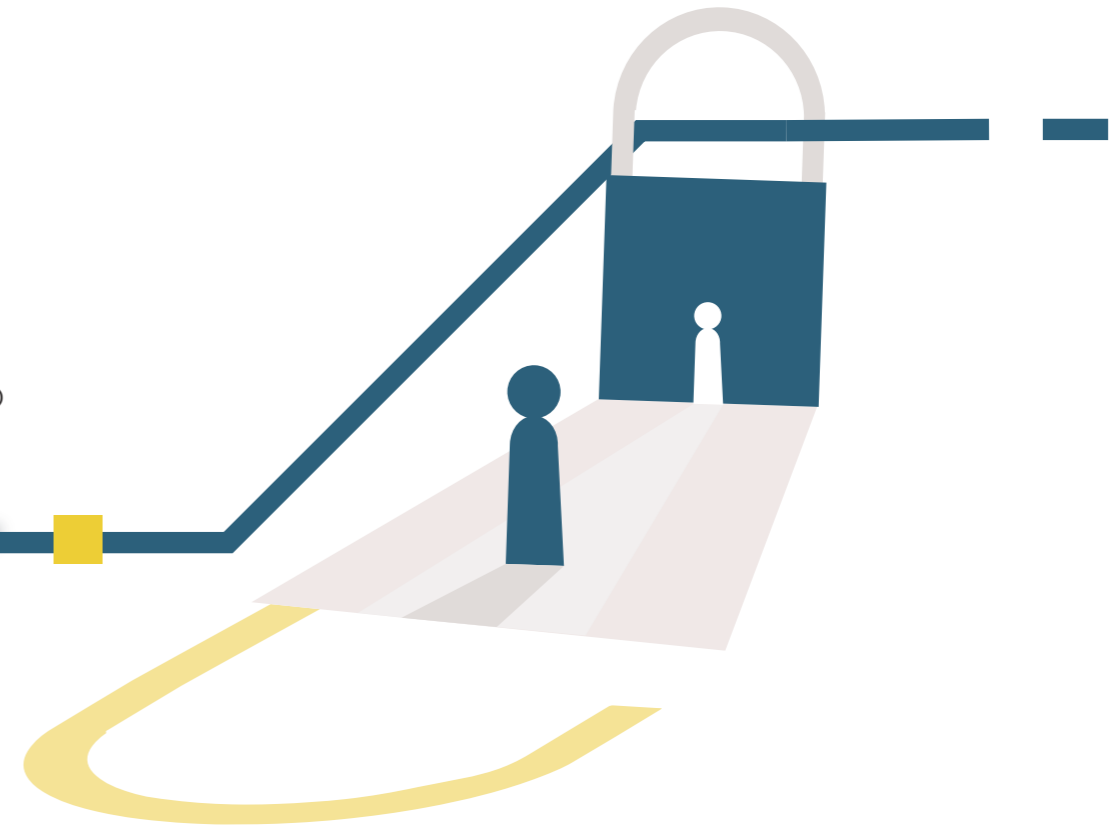

## OPEN PUBLIC PROCUREMENT

## WHAT WE NEED

**1**

A comprehensive public procurement platform with complete public procurement information free of charge in an easy-to-use format



**2**

Data should be published by default in an open, machine-readable and easy-to-understand data format



**3**

Rules on which data on public procurement should be the same across Member States



**4**

All the tender phases should be made public



**5**

Data on the whole procurement cycle should be published allowing to identify the story of a public work or services



**6**

Data quality and the reduction of the administrative burden should be guaranteed
